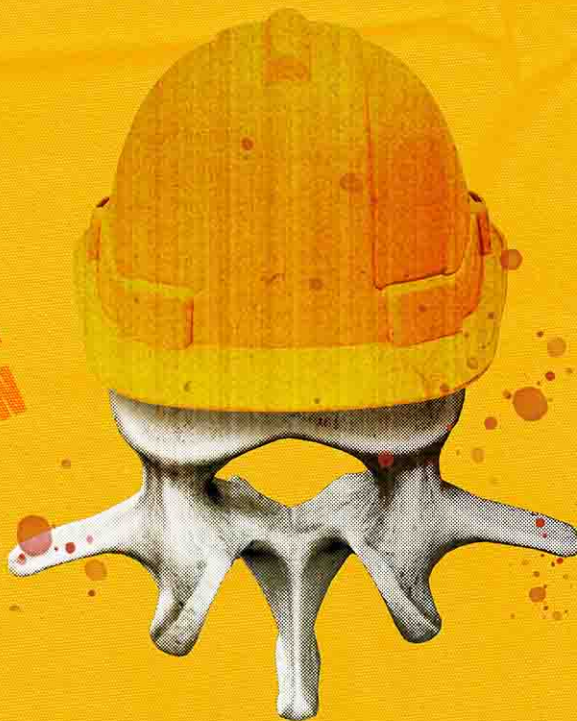

- Share how to acknowledge quality and safety in spine surgery
 - Learn how to build new clinical and surgical approach on quality and safety
- Share innovating performances, ideas, experiences on quality and patient safety that challenge established practices
- Learn how the multidisciplinary team resources create quality and patient safety in the operating theatre



SCIENTIFIC INFORMATION

"Nursing Round" is a nursing procedure that involves all the clinical activities performed on the patient. The training course is aimed at operating-room personnel (nurses), physiotherapists and radiology technicians that already have experience in this sector of spinal surgery. Open to outsiders, both lecturers and students, the training includes academic and practical sections with a final examination.

An integral and fundamental part of the theoretical session of the course "Nursing Round" is the "live" transmission of surgical procedures from the operating room via an audio-video link to the lecture hall. This will allow real time participation of the various phases of surgical intervention and discussion with the surgical team.

As a result of the strong collaboration between the multi-disciplinary team of surgeons, nurses and radiology technicians, the course offers these health working professionals dedicated to the well-being of the spinal surgery patient, the opportunity to exchange ideas and experiences with regard to resolving errors in clinical practice.

Nurses, surgeons, physiotherapists, medical radiology technicians, neurology technician, auxiliary healthworkers.

ABSTRACT AND POSTER PRESENTATION

The programme of the course includes time for contributions from participants who wish to submit abstracts inherent to the course topics.

The abstracts will be selected by the scientific committee and those chosen will be included in the programme as scientific reports within the theoretical sessions. Those chosen as poster will be included in the poster session.

Contributions should be sent in the form of abstracts and typed in text editor Microsoft Word type, they must not exceed **500 characters**, and must clearly contain the **title of the presentation and the authors**.
